SUEZ ENVIRONNEMENT IS RESTRUCTURING IN ORDER TO ACCELERATE ITS DEVELOPMENT

SUEZ ENVIRONNEMENT is consolidating its organisational structure in order to speed up its development and seize opportunities for growth.

The new structure will enable the Group to continue its development around four strategic priorities – Smart Water, waste recovery, new international models and industrial water – while boosting the profitability of its businesses.

All operating activities have therefore been placed under the authority of four Deputy Chief Executive Officers:

- **Christophe Cros**, Deputy Chief Executive Officer in charge of Waste Europe, operating under the SITA brand
- **Angel Simon**, Deputy Chief Executive Officer in charge of Water Europe, principally for Lyonnaise des Eaux and Agbar
- **Marie-Ange Debon**, Deputy Chief Executive Officer in charge of International activities (Degrémont, USA, Africa-Middle East, Asia-Pacific)

Jean-Marc Boursier, Deputy Chief Executive Officer in charge of Finance and Purchasing.

The Management Committee will therefore be comprised of the Chief Executive Officer, the four Deputy Chief Executive Officers, Denys Neymon, Director of Human Resources, and Frédérique Raoult, Director of Communications and Sustainable Development.

A new Department of Innovation and Business Performance has also been created, under the supervision of **Thierry Mallet**.

Thanks to this new department, the Group will be better equipped to respond to the expectations of its customers – both public and industrial – and will be more focused on technology and innovation, value-added services and operational efficiency.
